Welcome to Year 2 - Hungry Caterpillar class! I am really looking forward to the year ahead with all of you. I hope you have had a wonderful and restful summer and are ready for our busy half term.

This half term we will be historians looking into the evidence that we can use to find out about the past. Our big question is 'Why do we remember the Great Fire of London?' We will be investigating and sequencing the events which resulted in the Great Fire of London. We will be looking at the significant historical figures of the time and learning about the changes that came about as a result of the fire.

As scientists we will develop our knowledge about materials, thinking about why the Great Fire spread and how the materials used to build with have changed. London has some beautiful architecture, which we will look at more closely and the suitability of the materials. Having learned about the danger of fire, we will then - with help from the Fire Service - learn how to keep ourselves safe.

### **Class Organisation**
