Geography

Objectives

Where in the world is Kampong Ayer?

Compare human and physical features in the UK to Kampong Ayer How do people's homes at Kampong Ayer compare with mine? How does the weather at Kampong Ayer compare with the weather where I live?

Comparison of British forests and Tropical rainforest.

Outcomes

Children will produce answers to our key questions relating to the similarities and differences between Blandford and Kampong Ayer.

Maths

Our early morning task before the register, Flashback 4, is designed to support children with learning previous aspects of the maths curriculum.

We will also continue to use Number Sense to build mental maths capacity.

Areas to be studied:

Science - Living things and their habitats:

Objectives

Explore and compare the differences between things that are living, dead and things that have never been alive

Identify most living things live in habitats to which they are suited and describe how different habitats provide for basic needs of different kinds of animals and plants and how the depend on each other.

Identify and name a variety of plants and animals in their habitat, including microhabitats.

Describe how animals obtain their food from plants and other animals, using the idea of a simple food chain and identify and name different sources of food.

Outcomes

Find a range of items which are dead, living.

Can name plants/animals which live in different habitats and micro habitat.

Can talk about the features of the animal/plant and how they are suited to the habitat.

Can talk about what the animal eats. Can construct a food chain.

RE -Question: "Why does Easter matter to Christians?"

Objectives
