Topic: Hard Rock to Heavy Metal

National Curriculum

In English, we will be writing a portal story based on the text *Elf Road*. We will use all the information we learn during our History lessons to help write our portal stories!

As mathematicians, we will be learning about fractions. We will focus on learning about what the numerator and denominator are, comparing and ordering fractions, as well as understanding what unit and non-unit fractions are.

As historians, we will be going back in time to the Stone Age! We will explore how this fits into our time line and how life was different to what we know today.

As scientists, we will be revising different features of plants and their functions. We will also be looking at the life cycle of flowering plants and investigate the requirements needed for them to grow by growing our own plants. We will also be learning about how we can be sustainable in the modern world.

As artists, we will be building our own Stone Age settlements using different materials. We will also creating our own resources to paint cave paintings!

Text Genre: Portal stories, Instructions

GPS/phonics focus: Subordinate clauses and conjunctions, adverbs, prepositions, direct speech, prefixes, suffixes, homophones and organisational devices

History

Objectives:

Stone Age to Iron Age

- To understand where the Stone Age and the Iron Age occur in a historical timeline.
- To understand the difference in religion, technology and travel through time in Britain.
- To use a variety of sources to learn about a given time period.

Outcomes

To be able to understand the concept of change over time and be able to place events on a time line. To compare the past to the present using sources. Objectives

- To sketch a design using varying pressure with a pencil.

Outcome

RE: Salvation

Key Question - Why do Christians call the day Jesus died 'Good Friday'?

Objectives

Offer suggestions about what the narrative of the Last Supper, Judas' betrayal and Peter's denial might mean for Christians.

Make clear links between Gospel texts and how Christians remember this significant aspect of Christianity.

Describe how Christians show their beliefs about Jesus in their everyday lives: for example, prayer, serving, sharing the message and the example of Jesus.

Raise questions and suggest answers about how serving and celebrating, remembering and betrayal, trust and standing up for your beliefs might make a difference to how pupils think and live.
