Computing - Vector Diagrams

Objectives

In this unit pupils will find out that vector images are made up of shapes. They will learn how to use the different drawing tools and how images are created in layers.

They will explore the ways in which images can be grouped and duplicated to support them in creating more complex pieces of work.

Outcomes

To be able to add and remove objects to create a drawing with some detail.

To be able to modify the objects in order to achieve desired effects to create a drawing with some detail .

To be able to combine a range of objects, apply layers and groups to draw a whole image with some detail.

Design Technology - Structures

Objectives

Design, make and evaluate a structure made of both a frame and an outer layer that demonstrates an understanding of how to strengthen, stiffen and reinforce 3D frameworks.

Outcomes

Pupils will use their sketch books to record their observations and use them to review and revisit ideas. They will improve their mastery of design techniques, including drawing and constructing with a change of materials. Designing and making paper lanterns for the Lantern Parade at the Yuletide Festival.
